
Dear Neighbors,

Thank you for the honor of serving you as your mayor and again, please consider my invitation to get involved in one of the many worthwhile civic organizations that are the backbone of our community.




Greetings from your Council President,

Wenonah Historical Society, by Charles Horan, President, Wenonah Historical Society

he Wenonah Historical Society was created in 1982 with the mission to educate, preserve and propagate the history of this very unique community. Part of our educational aspect is the annual program presented to the fifth graders of Wenonah School on the history of their town. In the mid 1970s, as the Train Station was being renovated, our distinguished member, Marjorie Lentz, published a definitive history of Wenonah. This publication was updated and revised in 2009 and is available at the library. Many Wenonah historical artifacts are preserved and archived in our "museum" in the Community Center.

The Wenonah Historical Society meets on the second Friday of each month (except July & August) in the Train Station at 7:30. Programs on topics of local historical interest are presented each month. Guests and prospective new members are always welcome.

Wenonah Environmental Commission




The Wenonah Environmental Commission (WEC) is charged with preserving Wenonah's unique natural resources for the enjoyment of local residents. WEC manages 135 acres of conservation land, which is over 21% of the borough's land area. Their long-standing objective is to create a "Ring of Green" around the borough. The ring is a continuous area of land kept not just in an undeveloped state, but in a healthy and accessible state. To that end, WEC has and continues to: Restore Wenonah's historic ponds and lakes; Protect our streams from silt-laden runoff, trash, and other debris; Construct foot trails; to allow everyone to appreciate our natural wonders close up; and Educate the public – especially our youngest citizens – about our local environment and how to best conserve it.






Wenonah Police Department To Protect and Serve


Wenonah Lake




The Wenonah Lions Club



WENONAH'S SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL GUIDELINES

In an effort to contain the cost of solid waste disposal the following guidelines have been developed.

Recycle on Fridays

When

.

- Place recycling items in your recycle container at the curb Thursday evening or on Friday by 6:45am.
- After collection, please remove empty container promptly from curbside.
- Please call the Finance Office with your recycling questions
 468-5228 or Public Works @ 468-5300.

What to Recycle - some examples:

- Glass bottles and jars (please rinse.)
- Aluminum, tin, bi-metal, and steel cans (please rinse.)
- Newspapers, cardboard, food boxes, magazines.
- Plastic containers (#'s 1 to 7.)

What NOT to Recycle - some examples:

- Window glass, mirrors, plates, light bulbs, ceramics, crystal, or aerosol cans – go with trash.
- Empty containers of oil based paint, gasoline, other hazardous household chemicals, or materials.*
- Please take plastic grocery bags back to store for recycling.
- Household alkaline batteries may be included with trash
- (No button batteries in trash please.)

Please **DO NOT**: Dispose of household waste, chemicals, medicine, poisons, etc. in a toilet, household drain, catch or storm drain where they will contaminate soil, local streams, or drinking water sources.

Used Motor Oil Disposal

For disposal information call Public Works @ 468-5300 and leave your name and phone number. Oil should be put in clean plastic bottles and not be contaminated with other materials.

Trash Collection on Fridays

When

- Place trash at the curb Thursday evening or by 6:45am Friday.
- After collection remove empty container promptly from curbside.

How

- Use only provided container.
- Place all your trash in plastic bags before putting in the container.
- Container belongs to the Borough. If you move do not take it with you, please leave for the next resident.

What NOT to Include with your Trash:

- All trash or debris resulting from construction or home improvement is the responsibility of the contractor and/or homeowner. No exceptions. Includes bricks, cinder blocks, pressure treated wood or other building materials that do not comply with the guidelines.
- The homeowner or contractor is responsible for proper disposal of chain link fencing and other types of fencing.
- Wood remaining from tree removal.

Latex/Water Based Paint: See following for paint can disposal.

- (No more than ½ full) add kitty litter or speedy dry and then mix until completely dry. Place next to trash container.
- Leave paint can **lid off** to show paint has dried.

Special Pickup Non-Metal:

• Furniture, items too large for trash pickup, last Friday of the Month – By Trash Hauler.

Special Pickup Metal: Collected by Public Works Dept.

(no metal fencing)

- For pickup call Public Works @ 468-5300 (Monday-Friday).
- Leave your name/address/telephone number and metal item.

Bulk Leaf Collection

October 15th through December 16th

Please Do Not put leaves in bags or containers.

Place in street away from curbs, vehicles, and storm drains

Where should I put my leaves?

•

- During bulk leaf collection, please place leaves in the street.
- Place them far enough from the curb line to allow water to flow past to the catch basins.
- Leaves should be placed a minimum of 10-feet from all storm water catch basins.
- Please Do Not place leaves near a parked car.
 Adequate space is required for borough large leaf removal equipment.

Can I put other material with my leaves?

- Do not mix large shrubs, limbs or branches in with leaves.
- If these items are mixed in, or are on top of the leaves, they cannot be picked up.
- Pine needles may be included with leaves.
- See "Branches for Chipping" and "Yard Waste" guidelines.

When will my leaves be picked up?

- Leaves will be picked up on a continuous rotating basis throughout Wenonah from Oct. 15th thru Dec. 16th.
- These dates are dependent upon the weather, Public Works schedule, and in-town emergencies.



Snow Removal Guidelines

- When snow is expected please make every attempt to park your vehicle in a driveway.
- If you must park in the street use the odd-even system to facilitate snowplowing:
 - Odd Days, park on the odd-numbered side of the street

 Even Days, park on the even-numbered side of the street
- Please clear your sidewalks within 12 hours of snow fall.
- If possible, wait until the borough plows have passed before shoveling your driveway.
