Wenonah House, Garden Tour Sunday

The Wenonah Woman's Club is sponsoring a House and Garden Tour on Sunday from 1 to 4 p.m. The starting point will be the Wenonah Library at East Main and North Clinton Avenues, where tickets and tour maps will be available. There will be an exhibit level in the town's history, housed by the library which will benefit the library as well as other interests of the club.

The homes in Wenonah will be visited during the afternoon in that of Dr. and Mrs. Churchill B. Baker at 108 S. West Ave. Built in 1970, the house over a lawn, the living and dining rooms, done in colonial blue and white, are finished in the fine Queen Anne-English in a style. The kitchen is a contemporary reproduction of a design from that century and is open to the public.

The grounds also will be visited in that of Mr. and Mrs. Nathaniel A. White, at 100 S. West Ave. The house is a copy of one in Adams, Mass., and presents an appropriate background for family portraits and other items of interest. Rooms of lavender and white, in which exposed trees are in bloom, will be open to the public.

rooms, two kitchens, music, flower and billiard rooms, a library and lawn area. Of interest are stained glass windows at the top of a staircase; carved woodwork in its original state; beamed ceiling; and four fireplaces, each surrounded by a different material.

The furniture combines contemporary with antique pieces, and among the paintings are six dating back to the early 18th and 19th centuries.

Patricia A. Frick's autograph, the home of Mr. and Mrs. W. Kendall Albert Jr. at 24 E. Pine St. was built in the Queen's style. An architect, Mr. Frick's house overlooks a terrace and garden, in which three-quarters of an acre is devoted. The remaining three acres are wooded.

French Provincial in design the one-story house of Mr. and Mrs. Carl H. Gertzel is a combination of oak and brick. Located at 405 E. Morris St., it has a stone wall in the rear and a variety of past time.

Mr. and Mrs. Webster S. Brown's home at 105 S. Clinton Ave. is an example of Victorian architecture. Built in the late 1800s, it originally was in the shape of a cross. A veranda at the front of the house and a stone walk lead to a garden. The house has a garden with a variety of trees and shrubs, and in the living room, dining room and library, glass chandeliers reflect the Victorian style.
