

## Roy Bolig Enlists In U. S. Air Corps

Roy V. Bolig, local coal dealer, who was drawn for selective service to depart Wednesday, from Middleburg did not leave because he has enlisted in the United States Army Air Corps.

Son of Mr. and Mrs. Luther Bolig, Penn Avon, and former high school athletic star, Bolig received military training during his two years' attendance at Wenonah Military Academy from which place he was graduated.

Bolig enlisted Saturday in the Air Corps and will leave to-day for the Middletown Air Depot, to which he has been assigned. The buildings at the coal yard have been leased.

Word that he would not go with the Snyder county contingent reached the Snyder County Local Board at Middleburg too late to fill the place and a replacement will need to be sent later to fill the quota for the third April call.

The four selectees who left were in response to the April 30 call were Doyle H. Crebs and Robert G. Schuck both of Selinsgrove, R. D., Max T. Hoffman, McClure; Wm. B. Swartzlander, Middleburg, R. D. Going as a replacement for the selectee rejected on April 15, was Walter L. Dershem, also of Middleburg, R. D. Schuck came home from employment in Baltimore to report for training.

Four more selectees will leave in the first May call Friday, as follows: Russell D. Fisher, Shamokin Dam; John M. Hoffman, of Freeburg; Leroy T. Heim, of Mt. Pleasant Mills; Charles B. Boush, of Beavertown.

Henry Stetler, Middleburg, past president of the Snyder Council of Christian Education, made the speech on the departure of yesterday's group.

Up until today Snyder county has filled eight calls with a total of 45 men in the first six months of selective service. Seven men were rejected for physical defects and seven replacements have been sent.
