

**WENONAH BOY GETS
WEST POINT BERTH**

**Wins Wolverton Appointment
to Take Academy Entrance
Exams March 5**

Realization of a boyish ambition came yesterday to Charles Harlow Miles, of 100 Lincoln avenue, Wenonah, when the War Department in Washington announced his appointment to the U. S. Military Academy at West Point upon the recommendation of Congressman Wolverton, of this city.

Miles will take his entrance examinations to West Point about March 5 with a view to entering the academy July 1 of next year, the War Department discloses.

Seven years ago the youngster matriculated at Wenonah Military Academy with a view to seeking a nomination to West Point when he graduated. His natural military ability led to Miles' rapid rise at Wenonah, being promoted to battalion major of the cadet corps in his post-graduate term this past year.

Miles, beside ranking high scholastically at Wenonah, won his letter in two major sports. He was a member of the track team during the seasons of 1926-'27 and 1928, captaining the cinder-path performers in his last two years.

He also played centre on the Cadets football machines of 1926 and 1927, and according to Head Coach George Baker, is one of the most deadly open-field tacklers he has ever developed. Miles was manager of the Wenonah Varsity basketball squad in his last year at the academy.

Miles is only the second graduate of Wenonah to ever be named to the U. S. Military Academy.
